About the speaker. *Ingrid Van Keilegom is a full professor at the Institut de Statistique, Biostatistique et Sciences Actuarielles (ISBA) in the Université catholique de Louvain (Belgium). Her research fields include different areas within statistics, such as survival analysis, empirical processes, M and Z semiparametric estimation, nonparametric and semiparametric regression, inference on/with copula models and endogeneity problems in econometrics. Apart from having published a large number of papers in top journals, she has been associate editor of Annals of Statistics, Scandinavian Journal of Statistics or Annals of the Institut of Statistical Mathematics, among others. Currently, she is the editor for Journal of the Royal Statistical Society – Series B.*
